Despite the struggles of 2022, Comfort Cases' board, staff, and volunteers dug in our heels and simply refused to give up on helping and advocating on behalf of children and youth in foster care. As we rounded the corner into 2023 we packed and distributed our 200,000th Comfort Case®!

Children who are abused, in extreme poverty, and have experienced institutional negligence, are entitled to hope, purpose, dignity, and love. As this Annual Report hopes to show you, it was a busy year. We inspire communities to bring dignity and hope to youth in foster care through Comfort, Community, Character, and Compassion.


On any given day, there are approximately 437,500 children in foster care in the United States. Most of them are removed from their homes with little more than the clothes on their backs. If they do have any personal belongings, they are given a trash bag in which to carry them.

At Comfort Cases, we believe that every child deserves to feel a sense of dignity. Every child deserves to pack their belongings in a special bag that they can call their very own. Every child deserves to have a cozy new pair of pajamas, a brand new warm blanket, and a new stuffed animal to hug during the traumatic transition into foster care.

Comfort Cases exists to serve children and youth in foster care in the United States, Puerto Rico and the U.K. The organization has also responded to requests for children seeking refuge in the United States.





"Because we are a therapeutic agency that often takes children in crisis or difficult-to-place children, we often get children who do not have necessities upon arrival. We have gotten comfort bags from other organizations in the past, however, the quality of the items and bookbags were not always suitable.

Comfort Cases® and are able to proudly give them to children in need knowing that the children will not feel that they are being looked down upon due to receiving low-quality items. We have used most of the bags we ordered previously but found that more teenagers are entering our care. As a result, we are in need of bags with larger sizes.



We offer Comfort XL duffel bags which truly replace the need for trash bags for children entering foster care. The Comfort XL is a 32-inch duffel bag that folds up to easily fit on an office shelf, in a desk drawer, or in the trunk of a car.


Our goal is for every social worker and police officer in the country to have a supply of Comfort XL duffel bags to give to children when they are removed from their homes.

FINANCIAL REPORT


Only 4% of every Program dollar is spent on Operating Expenses.


ADVOCACY

In 2022, Comfort Cases produced a total of **53 Fostering Change podcasts** featuring a variety of special guests with knowledge and experience in the foster care system. Now in its 4th Season, Comfort Cases founder Rob Scheer hosts this inspiring show about how communities can come together to bring dignity and hope to children in the foster care system. Guests include former youth in foster care, foster parents, celebrities touched by the foster care system, child welfare advocates, authors, and every day "Good Humans" working to improve the lives of kids in foster care.

2022 marks the second year Fostering Change has been voted the #1 podcast in the adoption category!

Comfort Cases also participates in an average of 10 speaking engagements per month (more than 120 per year!) - from corporate groups and universities with hundreds of people in the audience to senior centers and school assemblies.




STATE-BY-STATE
